Delta Dental donates \$40,000 to expand access to dental care through school-based dental services

(Louisville, KY) October 23, 2018- Delta Dental® of Kentucky is continuing to Make Smiles Happen with a \$40,000 donation to the Shawnee Christian Healthcare Center’s ‘Smiles for Kids’ program.

Shawnee Christian Healthcare Center (SCHC) is a federally qualified health center located in west Louisville, Kentucky. The center specializes in serving low income, and medically underserved patients. In early 2017, a dental clinic was established at the center. With the grant from Delta Dental, SCHC will enhance the clinic’s pediatric dental services which will include expanding the ‘Smile for Kids’ program to encompass new school-based dental clinics. These site locations will be at Young Elementary, Byck Elementary, Hazelwood Elementary, Duvall Education Center, and Dawson Orman Education Center.

The first school-based dental clinic in Jefferson county was established in 2016 when SCHC first partnered with the Jefferson County Public School (JCPS) system. Video specialists from JCPS were on-site at Hazelwood Elementary on the afternoon of Oct. 22 to capture the partnership between JCPS, SCHC, and Delta Dental- the piece highlights the importance of the services being provided to students. “This year alone, the JCPS Board of Education approved five new schools and early education sites to receive these school-based dental services,” says Lindsay Nelson, the Director of Development and Grant Programs at Shawnee Christian Healthcare Center. “That’s a huge stride for oral health care in Louisville- an accomplishment made possible by Delta Dental. We’re looking forward to their continued partnership in hopes that this is only the beginning of continuing to establish these school-based services across the city.”
